Starting a farm stay takes an investment of your time and effort, as well as start-up capital costs, but it doesn't have to be difficult. As you work through each step of the guide, you'll start to build the picture of what is involved.





Important regulations

Starting a farm stay is extremely rewarding, but there are certain local laws and state regulations you may have to abide by.

The Farm Stay Guide steps you through this process, and with support from GSD, Council, State Government agencies that look after leasehold land and Native Title arrangements, and your legal adviser, you can manage this process.

Aspects to consider include:

- If your tenure allows for farm stay operations
- Whether you have native title requirements and what permission you need to use the land for non-pastoral use
- What accommodation licences/approvals you should apply for from your local council or the state
- Planning scheme requirements for your local area
- Whether you need to obtain building and plumbing permits for dwellings
- What duty of care there might be with regards to Aboriginal Cultural Heritage
- How to comply with any approvals and/or licences for additional activities such as wildlife encounters
- What codes of practice and national standards are relevant to the setup of your business

Setting up for success

When establishing a farm stay, you'll need to work through steps that will ultimately set you up for success. A bit of hard work in the beginning can save a lot of time and effort down the track.

The guide suggests simple actions for you to complete. It also points you to additional information and support that will help you reach your goal.
